Our Curriculum

Maths:

The children are going to start the term by looking at the area and perimeter of shapes. They will start by recapping how to measure the perimeter of shapes and rectangles before moving onto finding the perimeter of rectilinear shapes including shapes with missing measures. The children will then move on to looking at calculating the area of shapes by finding the area of rectangles before calculating the area of compound shape and answering reasoning and problem solving questions about area and perimeter.

The children will then move on to looking at statistics and data which interprets in charts, line graphs and tables. They will learn to read and interpret the information presented and answer sum and comparison questions based on the data. They will then use data from a Science experiment to create/draw a line graph before looking at timetables and answering questions based on the information presented.

The children will finish the term by looking at formal methods of multiplication and division. They will start by recapping the grid method of multiplication to multiply 2 digit numbers by 1 digit and 3 digit numbers by 1 digit before developing their learning by multiplying 4 digits by 1 digit and then multiplying 2/3 and 4 digit numbers by 2 digits. They will then move onto division and recap using the bus stop method to divide 2/3 and 4 digit numbers by 1 digit and also how to express remainders.

Times tables:

This year, we will continue to focus on times tables. It was a government expectation that by the end of Year 4, all children should know their times table and division facts up to and including 12 x 12. To continue to support the children with their times tables they will be singing songs and doing times table focused activities as part of their Maths lessons.

Throughout the year, the children will continue to be tested on their times tables to further boost/secure their knowledge and also give them an opportunity to earn their times tables certificates.

English:

This term the children are writing with the purpose to persuade. They will start by writing a persuasive letter to try and persuade the reader to visit The Cafe in the Woods. The letters will include emotive language and a range of subordinating and coordinating conjunctions as well as other features we have looked at in Year 4 and 5. They will then write a persuasive speech which will include rhetorical questions, modal verbs and adverbs.

Spelling Shed

To help develop the children's spelling, we use Spelling Shed. This program has fantastic games/resources to help the children practice their weekly spellings. The children will be given assignments every week based on a spelling rule and will then be tested in class on that rule the following week.

Science

In Science the children will be building on their Year 4 materials learning by looking at States of Matter. They will be looking at the properties of materials and how heating or cooling an object can change the state between solids, liquids and gases. They will also investigate which materials make the best thermal insulators and which materials are magnetic and how these can be used in the wider world.

Towards the end of the unit, the children will investigate which objects are soluble and insoluble and be given materials which have been 'accidentally' mixed and asked to separate them before finishing the topic by looking at examples of irreversible changes in the world.

Geography:

Our Geography topic for the term is Renewable Energy. The children will start by looking at what renewable energy is and why it is important focusing on wind power and creating their wind turbines. They will then have a look at the different types of renewable energy and how they work before looking at the effects Global Warming has on the planet and then changes that are happening as a result of it.

They will conclude the topic by investigating where the best places are to put renewable energy to ensure they are effective and identifying how the installation of renewable energy sites change the landscape and economy of the local area.
