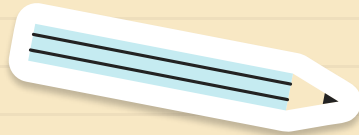

Expectations

Equipment Packs – All children have their own equipment packs. These should not be taken home and it is the children's responsibility to look after them.

PE kits – Our PE sessions are on a Monday. Children should bring their PE kit and change in school. Children are not to wear earrings on PE days.

Homework - Pick 'n' Mix homework sheets have already been handed out. New homework will be handed out on a Friday and collected back in on a Wednesday. The majority of this is to be completed on LBQ – the children have their logins.

Uniform – Only Wygate uniform should be worn with black shoes. Please make sure these are school shoes and not bright trainers. Please make sure that your child comes to school with a coat for cold and rainy days.



Carrot rewards and traffic lights

We will continue to use Carrot Rewards as incentives within school. Children can order gifts with their carrot points and a 'Carrot Conqueror of the Term' will be awarded every term.

At Wygate, the traffic light behaviour system is still used in class. A child may be moved onto amber during lesson if they are making poor choices after having a warning. If a child continues to show this unacceptable behaviour, they will be moved to Red. This equates to 5 mins off their breaktime, a carrot point deducted and a conversation with a parent/guardian at home time. The traffic light system resets every lesson.

Healthy packed lunches



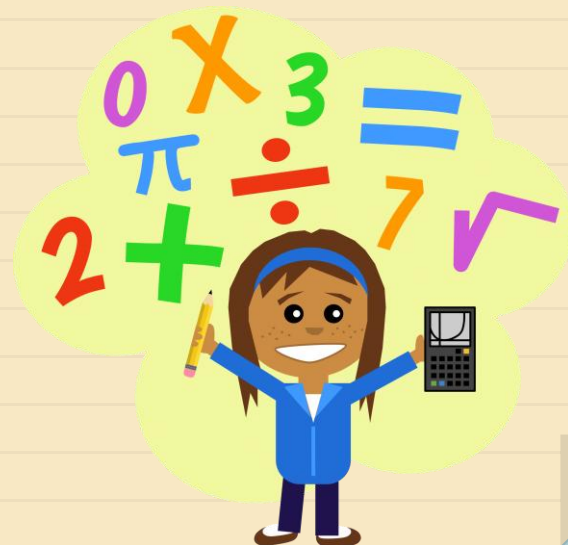
Now that the children are in KS2, fruit is no longer provided for them at break times. If you wish to, please send your child in with a healthy snack.

- ✓ Times Tables



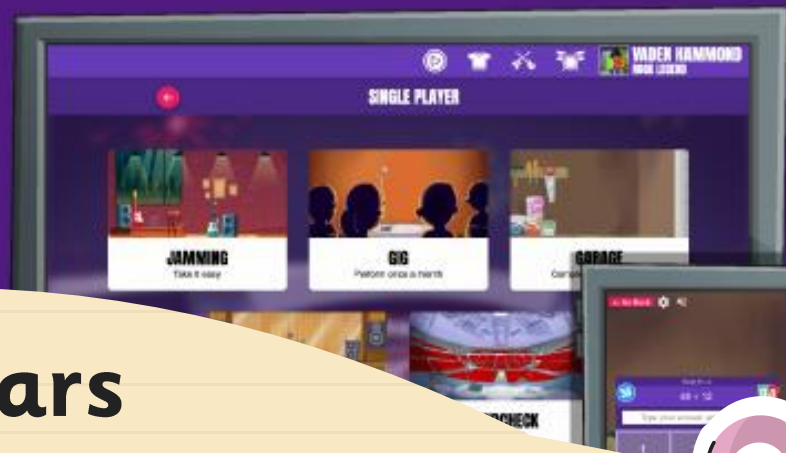
Maths – Times Tables

- ✓ Children should be practising their times tables 3x a week as part of their Pick 'n' mix homework to support learning in maths.
- ✓ Children need to know their multiplication and division facts.
- ✓ By the end of year 3, all children should know their 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables.
- ✓ There are certificates available to children if they are fluent in their times tables – this includes division facts.
- ✓ TT Rockstar competitions will take place throughout the year (dates TBC)

Certificate:	Criteria:
Pink	I can count in 10's up to 100. I can double, halve and share numbers to 20.
Red	I can count in 2's, 5's and 10's forwards, backwards and starting from different numbers.
Blue	I can recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.
Green	I can recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.
Purple	I can recall and use multiplication and division facts for times tables up to 12×12 .
Silver	I can multiply and divide whole numbers and decimals by 10, 100 and 1000.
Gold	I can calculate multiplication facts for 2-digit numbers $\times$ 1-digit numbers and 3-digit numbers $\times$ 1-digit numbers.

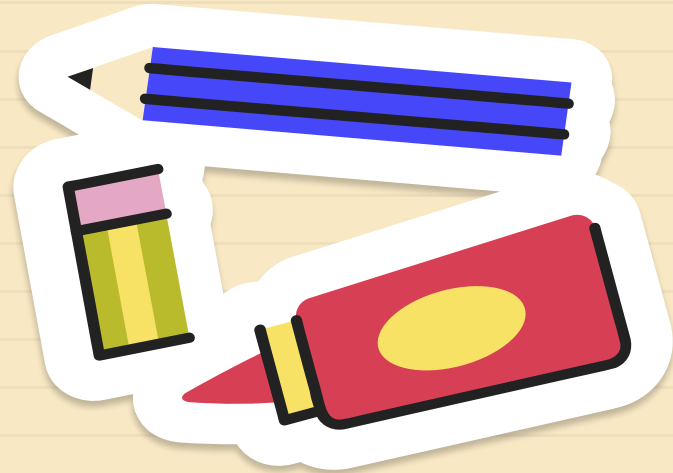

Reading for Pleasure

We are continuing to develop and encourage reading for pleasure in school. Children will have a guided reading session in the library, in which they can read any text they wish.

Reading is the vital skill that underpins children's learning, imagination and world knowledge.

Children should see teachers and parents as readers as this helps to contribute to their own enjoyment of reading.

Children will receive two reading books per week: a specific book focusing on their reading level and a reading for pleasure book. When your child reads at home, this should be logged on Boom Reader (logins are stuck into homework books).

Reading for Pleasure - continued

Encouraging children to read can sometimes be difficult. Here are a few ideas that could potential help:

- ✓ Have a family bookshelf or allow children to have access to books in their bedrooms.
- ✓ Keep reading together. Reading with your children is a fantastic way to help them develop a love for reading.
- ✓ Visit the local library together. Spalding library has access to a variety of genres.
- ✓ Encourage children and their friends to swap books with each other. This will encourage discussions about reading.
- ✓ Reading around the house – could your children help with dinner by reading a recipe? Could they help put furniture together by reading the instructions? Could they read the shopping list out to you in the supermarket?

PSHE/RSE

We aim to promote personal wellbeing and development through the mindful approach of Jigsaw PSHE.

From September 2020, the Department for Education made Relationships Sex Education and Health Education compulsory in all schools.

Rules

- ✓ No personal questions to be asked
- ✓ Show respect for the views of others
- ✓ Use appropriate language
- ✓ Only talk about what has been discussed in with children of the same age or older.

- ✓ Rocks and soils



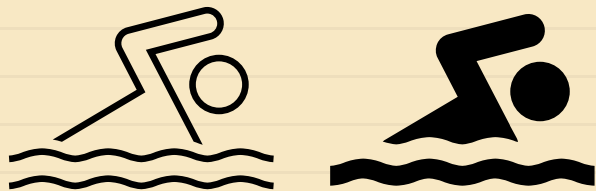
Swimming

Year 3 will be swimming during the summer term (date TBC)

This is part of the curriculum and is compulsory. It is a fantastic opportunity for children to be active and develop their swimming.

All children will need a swim cap – they will not be able to swim without these as outlined in the swimming pool's rules.

Girls will need to wear a one-piece swimming costume. Two-pieces are not allowed. Children are not to wear swimming t-shirts.



PE Non-Participation

Physical Education is highly important for the mental and physical well-being of our children.

Pupils should participate in PE lessons unless there is a suitable reason. School must be notified and provided with information as to why the child is unable to take part. This helps us assess which appropriate role they may take in the lesson. Although the pupil may be unable to participate practically in the lesson, this does not mean that they are unable to be a part of the wider learning experience. This will also ensure that children are better prepared to re-join lessons when able.

Depending on the reason for non-participation the pupils could be asked to:

- Act as a coach/leader for a group.
- Provide peer assessment (being a critical friend).
- Act as an official.
- Create questions to ask the group to assess other pupil's knowledge.

Children who forget their kit will participate by wearing spare PE kit which has been purchased by the school.

We will be using the Pick 'n' mix homework again this year.

Red – MUST be completed every week.

Yellow – one to be completed each week.

Green – Extra homework (if they want to do a bit more).

MyEd

As a pupil I will:

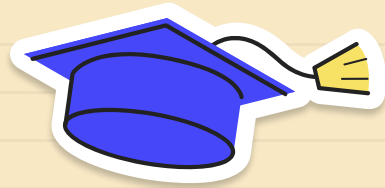
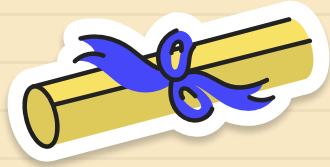
- come to school regularly and on time,
