## This term, we are looking at

#### Maths

In Maths this term, we are looking at the addition and subtraction, shape, and consolidating place value of numbers to 20 and above.

To further develop the children's learning, they will also be exposed to reasoning and problem solving questions. These questions extend their learning and allow them to apply their knowledge to real life situations.

#### **English**

In English, the children will be creating pieces of writing with the focus on entertaining.

The children will be developing their writing by learning new word types like adjectives and nouns. The children will be encouraged to use adjectives in their writing to add description and detail. The children will focus on writing to entertain and will be writing narratives, poems, and character descriptions.

A big focus on writing is for the children to be able to verbalise their sentence before they write it. Encourage your child to speak what they would like to write and reinforce any misunderstandings in speech.

To help develop the children's spelling, we use Spelling Shed. This program has fantastic games/resources to help the children practice their weekly spellings. The children will be set assignments each week which match their weekly spellings.

#### Science

In Science, the children will be looking at seasons and how they are different. The children will learn what months are in each season and what the weather is like.

### **Humanities (History and Geography)**

Our topic this term is called Where We Live. This topic is a geography based topic which develops the children's knowledge and understanding on our local environment and geography. We will be learning about the United Kingdom and the 4 countries which it is made up of. We will also learn of their Capital cities and the surrounding seas. The children will also be spending time using atlases and globes to understand more about the earth.

## **Important Information**

#### **Phonics Screen Check**

In June 2026, the children will be sitting a phonics screening check (PSC). The PSC is an assessment designed to determine whether pupils are able to sufficiently decode a variety of words.

We will be practising phonics in school which will include weekly practice.

I encourage you to practice phonics at home when reading and writing and encourage your child to sound and squash the words they are attempting to read and spell.

#### **Boom Reader**

Your child will shortly be allocated 2 reading books and will read with a member of staff at least once a week.

This year we are continuing with Boom Reader (formerly known as Go Read) to log reading activity. When using this application, could you please be careful when logging reading to record whether the reading is with a parent or the child read independently.

#### Homework

Homework will be set on a Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. The homework is always fully explained to the children and often recaps things they have been learning in class. The children will be sent home with a copy of the pick and mix grid which has the homework for the term on (this is also available on the school's website).

#### **Water Bottles**

We are allowing children to bring plastic water bottles into school. However, please ensure that it contains water as squash and fizzy drinks are not permitted in the classroom. We also ask that all water bottles are named so the children can easily identify theirs. Please note, glass bottles are not permitted in school.

#### PlusPay

Bookings for lunches, breakfast and afterschool club should now be made on PlusPay, which is the payment system within the MyEd app.

#### MyEd

Please keep an eye on MyEd as any important information, notices and letters will be posted on the app. We will also post some of the amazing work the children have been doing in class and celebrate some of their successes through our social media platforms.

#### **Carrot Rewards**

Children can earn a range of certificates based on the amount of Carrot Reward points they earn and at the end of every term the 10 highest earners will win special certificates to celebrate their hard work. As well as this, the Carrot Reward points can be spent in the online shop and the items the children buy will be brought down to the classroom by Mrs Cross and Mrs Cannon.
