# This term, we are looking at

### Maths:

This term in maths the children are looking at area, multiplication and division.

The children will begin the term by looking at the area of shapes. They will work out how to calculate the area before investigating different shapes with the same area before concluding by comparing shapes with different areas.

The children will then be taking an in-depth look at each of the times tables to identify the facts, patterns and secure their times table and division knowledge. They will also practice using the multiplication and division facts to solve RPS questions. As well as this, they will be looking at multiplying a number by 1 and 0, dividing a number by itself and 1 and multiplying 3 numbers.

### **Times tables**

This term, we will continue to focus on times tables. It is a government expectation that by the end of Year 4, all children should know their times table and division facts up to and including 12 x 12. To support the children with their times tables knowledge, they will be having focused lessons each week to build up their times table and division knowledge and will also apply this knowledge to practical contexts.

The children will also be tested on their times tables weekly to help identify the times tables they are finding tricky and also be tested using the Rockslam function on TT Rockstars. The Rockslam is very similar to the MTC the children will sit in June 2026 and focuses on building up their recall skills.

### **English:**

This term, the purpose of the children's writing will be to inform.

The children will start by writing a non-chronological report to visitors and parents who would like their child to come to Wygate Park Academy to tell them all about our wonderful school. This will include all of the usual features of a non-chronological report (subheadings, formal language, technical language etc) as well as expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials.

The children will then finish the term by writing a newspaper article about Edgar the Dragon from the John Lewis advert. This will include the usual features and layout of a newspaper as well as subordinate clauses and direct speech. Once they have finished their articles, they will become news reporters and read their articles in front of a green screen.

Within this writing, the children will continue to develop their punctuation and grammar by recapping previous skills they have learnt whilst extending their knowledge of how to use causal conjunctions, time adverbials, subordinate clauses and a range of pronouns.

To help develop the children's spelling, we use Spelling Shed. This program has fantastic games/resources to help the children practice their weekly spellings. The children will be given assignments every week based on a spelling rule and will then be tested in class on that rule the following week.

# Science

In Science this term, the children will be looking at Electricity. They will look at how different objects are powered before creating simple circuits and identifying the different parts that make up a circuit. The children will also investigate what happens when multiple components are added to a circuit before exploring a range of materials to see which are conductors and which are insulators.

## **History and Geography**

This term, the children will be looking at food and farming.

The children will start the topic by identifying the importance of farming in the local area and develop an understanding of how different land patterns affect the crops that are grown. They will then research and develop an understanding of how Anglo-Saxon farming has influenced modern day farming techniques whilst comparing the structure of an Anglo-Saxon farm to a modern-day farm.

The children will then begin to look at the Lincolnshire Fenland and identify what it is, why it is used and what crops are grown on it - researching why Lincolnshire is called the 'breadbasket of England' and looking at all the crops grown in Lincolnshire whilst taking into account seasonality.

### Homework

Homework will be set on a Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. The homework is always fully explained to the children and often recaps things they have been learning in class. The children will be sent home with a copy of the pick and mix grid which has the homework for the term on (this is also available on the school's website). #### Water Bottles
