As part of your child's educational experience at Wygate Park Academy, we are committed to promoting personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive programme of Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) Education. Through our PSHE curriculum, children develop the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and skills they need to lead healthy, safe and successful lives, both now and in the future.

At Wygate Park Academy, we follow the Jigsaw approach to PSHE, which supports children's emotional wellbeing, personal development and understanding of the world around them.

This term, children will be taking part in the Jigsaw unit "**Changing Me**", which forms part of the statutory Relationships and Health Education curriculum that all primary schools are required to teach. As these lessons are statutory, children are expected to take part in them and cannot be withdrawn from this aspect of the curriculum.

The unit will cover age-appropriate learning about:

- Growing from young to old
- Differences in female and male bodies

We understand that some of these topics may lead to questions from children. To ensure lessons are taught in a safe, respectful and supportive environment, each class will establish clear ground rules, including:

- No personal questions being asked
- Respecting the views and opinions of others
- Using appropriate language at all times
