There will be a meeting for Year 6 parents on Wednesday 23rd September at 3.30 in the school hall. This is a great opportunity for you to come and meet your child's new teacher, see what will be happening in Year 6 and to ask any questions.

If you are unable to attend do not worry! We will make sure that the packs given to parents at the Curriculum Evening will be sent home to all parents who cannot attend.

Reading Books

Reading books will be sent home in week 3. As we have not seen the children in so long it is vital that we spend some time to accurately assess their current reading levels. We would like to encourage you to continue to spend time reading with your children at home and record when you have listened to them in their reading records. We suggest that this be done three times a week. Prior to the reading books being sent home, the children can access books to read online at readingeggs.com. Every child has a username and password for this. They will also have a 'reading for pleasure' book that they have chosen in their reading folders.

Attendance

Should your child be ill, please phone the school office to inform them of your child's absence.

Water Bottles

Water bottles can be brought into school but will remain in the children's bags during the day. Children will be able to access their water bottles when required. The children are welcome to bring in a bottle of water for playtimes and lunchtimes. Please make sure that this is labelled with the child's name and class and that it is filled with plain water (not squash or fizzy drinks).

Swimming

Due to the ongoing situation with Covid- 19 swimming will not take place at this current time. We will provide you with more information regarding this when we have it.

P.E. kits

This year PE will take place on a **Thursday**. Please can you make sure that your child has a PE kit in school each week. We recommend that PE kits are taken home regularly and washed.

Please will all parents and carers check that their children have labels in their kit with their name on or that their name is written on the labels in fabric pen. Alternatively, kits are now available on Amazon and other websites where you can have your child's name and class printed onto stickers. These are stuck onto the labels of the children's clothes and do not come off in the wash.

Head lice

We would like to remind children with long hair that it is important to keep it tied up to minimise the risk of catching head lice and to keep the children safe during P.E. and practical Science lessons.

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Homework will be set on a Friday and is due in every Wednesday. The homework is always explained to the children. If the children or you have any questions, I will be happy to run through the work with you. In Year 6, we do not use the 'Pick and Mix' system that your child will have used in previous years. Instead, they will be given a short reading comprehension, a SPAG activity and a maths activity. This is more in line with what they may receive at Secondary School and Year 6 is a great time to get them into good homework habits!

Spelling Journal

Spellings are set every Friday and the weekly spelling quiz is also on a Friday. The children will write their spelling scores in their spelling journals and these will then be sent home for parents to look at. In Year 6 it is also important that the children can spell the words on the Statutory Spelling List for Years 5/6. All children will have a copy of the list of words and know that they should be practising them on a regular basis at home.

Arrival and Pick Up Times

With the ongoing situation of Covid-19, we ask that you remind yourself and continue to adhere to the times given for your child to be dropped off and picked up from school. These times are in place to try and meet the social distancing measures as best as possible, for the safety of yourself and your child/children.

Here is a reminder of the times:

START TIMES:

EYFS & YEAR 1: 8:30am-8:40am

YEAR 2 & YEAR 3: 8:50am-9:00am

YEARS 4/5/6: 9:10am-9:20am

FINISH TIMES:

EYFS & YEAR 1: 2:50pm-3:00pm

YEAR 2 & YEAR 3: 3:10pm-3:20pm

YEARS 4/5/6: 3:30pm-3:40pm

- All parents MUST remain wherever possible at least 1m apart
- Only ONE parent should bring their child to school
- Parents MUST NOT share bringing children to school.
- Please be aware there will be limited space in the car park now.
- Parents MUST NOT congregate in groups on the school property

Siblings

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In order to maximise the learning within school, older siblings can be dropped off at the younger sibling time slot and the younger sibling can remain in school until the older sibling time slot.

This will avoid the need for parents to wait to collect both children, but will also support both siblings in receiving the maximum learning time within school. As before, the school will identify those families with siblings and notify these families, via WEDUC, on their drop off and pick up times. Any deviation from these times, as is normal practice in school, the Office will need to be notified in advance.

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
